

Community Council Meeting
April 25, 2017
Minutes

Present: council members: Bret Holmes, Jennifer Jensen, Anna Glazier, Kira Given, Lisa Gilstrap. Guests: Mayor Taylor, Officer Paul Rhoades, Adam Webster, Mr. and Mrs. Wilde, Mrs. Waters

Lisa discussed the state's approval of next year's Trust Land plan. A few expenditure clarifications were requested and it was approved with those.

Safety conversation with Mayor Taylor and Officer Rhoades- we didn't receive the UDOT grant the city applied for last year.

Some priorities and possible solutions for 1700 N and 2100 N were discussed. These will be presented to the North Ogden City Council on May 9th.

- Apply for the UDOT grant again with a smaller project
- 2100 N. possible solution- get a path to connect to the new subdivisions, giving the existing neighborhood a safe, complete walking path to the school. Paths are much less expensive and easier to work around power poles. We discussed working together to raise money to share in the cost of safety improvements, talking to homeowners to get easements/property rights if necessary. The city will help with identifying property owners and whether or not the easements are necessary and creating the legal documents if they are necessary.
- 1700 N. possible solution a solar crossing light at 700 East. Officer Rhoades has recently completed the survey of whether or not a crossing meets the state criteria for crossing guards. 1700 N does not due to the amount of traffic, the number of students crossing would at 30. The school will pay half of a solar crossing light. Supplementing sidewalks with pathways along 2100 is also an attainable solution. School community members can help with talking to people about easements if necessary and raising some of the funds.

Snow removal of sidewalks was also a concern. Discussed the walkway between homes coming into the school parking lot. Mr. Wilde has called the county to see who owned the walkway- initially he was told the city and the next time he was told no one owned it. Terry plows it, this year the snow piled up too high to get the snow blower through and then it was too hard to shovel. Mayor Taylor said he would check into the city clearing it.

(Not mentioned but needs to be addressed is the city plows pushing large snow banks blocking the East crossing access- district plows eventually came to clear it.)
