From the Desk of Principal Willie

Hello Grizzlies,

Welcome to term 2! Thank you for a great first term. Success in education is a team effort with faculty, staff, students and parents all working together.

Attendance is always a concern for schools. The concern has increased significantly in the past three years. During that time, attendance requirements were suspended by a state senate bill. That bill expired last year which means attendance is once again being tracked. Chronic absenteeism is defined as missing 18 or more days of the school year. Studies show that students who miss that much school struggle to keep up academically with their fellow students. Why wouldn't they? Missing classroom instruction always has a negative impact. If your student is sick, they should stay home. Generally, if they are vomiting or have a fever, they should stay home. A child with a small cough could probably still come to school. Obviously if they have Covid, they should stay home. Please be mindful of whether your child could be at school instead of staying home. Also, think about scheduling vacations during times that we are not in school. Save the absences for days when it is absolutely necessary.

We are worried about attendance school wide. With that in mind we have set a goal for the school, and grade level teams, to increase the average percentage of students in class every day by 2%. Thank you for your consideration.
